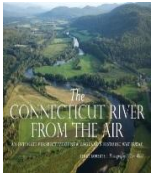
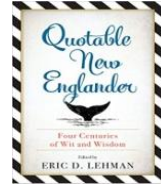

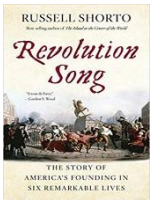
***The Connecticut River From The Air*, by Jerry Roberts, Photography by Tom Walsh**

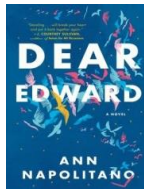
***Quotable New Englander*, Edited by Eric Lehman**

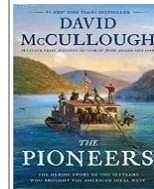
***Revolution Song*, by Russell Shorto**

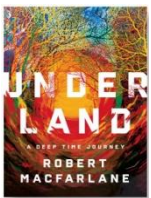
***Dear Edward*, by Ann Napolitano**

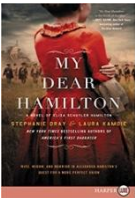
***Pioneers*, by David McCullough**
